Andrew Feinberg receives the BA (1973), the MD (1976) and the MPH degree (1981) at The Johns Hopkins University. He is currently King Fahd Professor of Medicine, Oncology, Molecular Biology & Genetics at School of Medicine; Professor of Biostatistics at School of Public Health; Gilman Scholar at Johns Hopkins University; Chief at Division of Molecular Medicine (Department of Medicine) and Director of the Center for Epigenetics. His research interests are focused on mechanisms of epigenetic modification, including DNA methylation and chromatin; the epigenetic basis of cancer and its relationship to normal differentiation; invention of new molecular, statistical and epidemiological tools for genome-scale epigenetics; and the epigenetic basis of neuropsychiatric disease, including schizophrenia and autism. Andrew Feinberg has been awarded several prestigious recognitions such as MERIT Award (National Institutes of Health, 2001); Doctor of Philosophy (Honoris Causa) at Uppsala University, Sweden (2007) and Doctor of Medicine (Honoris Causa) at Karolinska Institute, Sweden (2010).
