Kristian Helin, Director of [Biotech Research and Innovation Centre \(BRIC\)](#), and Professor at the Faculty of Health Sciences, [University of Copenhagen](#), Copenhagen, Denmark

Kristian Helin is the Director of BRIC and Professor at the Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Copenhagen. He graduated as MSc in Chemical Engineering from the Technical University of Denmark in 1988 and was awarded a Ph.D. in molecular biology from the University of Copenhagen for his research on the role of the human EGF receptor in cell proliferation and cancer. Between 1991 and 1993, Dr. Helin was a research fellow in the laboratory of Ed Harlow at the Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard Medical School in Boston, where he started working on the retinoblastoma protein and the E2F transcription factors. He returned to Denmark in 1994 to start as a group leader at the Danish Cancer Society in Copenhagen. In the end of 1995, Dr. Helin moved to the European Institute of Oncology in Milan as the head of one of the divisions in the Department of Experimental Oncology. Kristian Helin was appointed the Director of BRIC in 2003. From 2007 he has also been the Director of the Center for Epigenetics and the research school program Molecular Mechanisms of Disease. Prof. Helin was elected as a member of EMBO in 2002 and the Royal Danish Academy of Sciences and Letters. In 2008, he was awarded the prestigious Novo Nordisk Prize for outstanding biomedical research.
