Thomas Jenuwein obtained a Ph.D. Molecular Biology at the European Molecular Biology Laboratories (EMBL) in Heidelberg (1987). From 1988 to 1993 he was a Postdoctoral fellow in the laboratory of Dr. R. Grosschedl at UCSF, San Francisco. From 1990 to 1993 he received a special Fellow of the Leukemia Society of America. Between 1994 and 2001 Jenuwein was a Group Leader at the Institute of Molecular Pathology (IMP) in Vienna, and in 2002 he became senior scientist at the same institute. Since 2008, Jenuwein is the director and Scientific Member at the Max-Planck-Institute of Immunologie and Epigenetics. His research interests are focused on histone methylation, heterochromatin, epigenetic gene control, chromosome stability, cell-type inheritance, mammalian Polycomb and Su (var) genes, mouse development.

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
