Ernesto Liébana studied Veterinary Surgeon (Universidad Complutense, Spain), with a PhD in Microbiology (Universidad Complutense, Spain). Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists, UK. He has actively worked in Research in the area of Zoonoses and Public Health from 1991 to 2007, first as a postdoctoral scientist in the Veterinary Sciences Division (Department of Agriculture Northern Ireland) and then as a Senior Veterinary Research Officer in the Department of Food and Environmental Safety, and Pathology in the Veterinary Laboratories Agency, UK where he had primary responsibility over the molecular typing and detection group. His research interests were centred in Mycobacterium bovis, Salmonella, E. coli, Enterococci, and Campylobacter infections, as well as in the development of antimicrobial resistance in these organisms. In 2007 he joined the European Food Safety Authority as a Senior Scientific Officer. Since then he has been dedicated to the scientific coordination of risk assessment activities in the area of biological hazards. He is currently acting Head of the Biological Hazards Unit. In addition to his research work, he has been involved in a variety of university teaching activities. From lecturing and laboratory demonstrations to veterinary undergraduate students in the area of Microbiology (Universidad Complutense, Spain), to lecturing for MSc. Programs in Food Safety (University of Surrey, UK, University of Parma, Italy), and supervision of MSc and PhD students. He has also been invited to lecture at international symposiums in the area of molecular epidemiology. He was Honorary Lecturer in the Department of Medical Microbiology and Genitourinary Surgery, University of Liverpool; and Associated Invited Lecturer for the Doctorate Program “Ciencias Veterinarias” Veterinary School of Madrid, Universidad Complutense de Madrid, Spain.
