Helen Picton Bsc, PhD. Professor. Chair of Reproduction and Early Development, University of Leeds, Prof. Helen Picton is an ovarian biologist by training. She obtained her Bsc and PhD from the University of Edinburgh and is currently based at the University of Leeds where she established and now heads the Division of Reproduction and Early Development within the Leeds Institute of Genetics, Health and Therapeutics. She is the Scientific Director of the Leeds Centre For Reproductive Medicine in the Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust and the Programme Director for an international MSc in Clinical Embryology run by the University of Leeds. The research portfolio of the Reproduction and Early Development Group includes fundamental investigations of the molecular and cellular biology of oogenesis and folliculogenesis in large animals and humans, the application of these fundamental investigations to studies of the aetiology of female infertility, and the conservation of female fertility. She was the Chair of the Society For Reproduction and Fertility from 2005-2009 and is the current coordinator of the ESHRE Task Force on fertility preservation in severe disease.
