Robert Gehrig has a PhD in chemistry and is the deputy-head of the Laboratory for Air Pollution/Environmental Technology at EMPA, the Swiss Federal Laboratory for Materials Science and Technology (www.empa.ch). From 1979 to 1989 he was responsible for the planning, installation and operation of the Swiss National Monitoring Network for Air Pollutants (NABEL). Later he was the leader of the project "Air Pollution at forest sites" within the Swiss National Research Programme "Forest damages and Air Pollution". During the nineties his activities focussed on research projects in the field of indoor air pollution, namely the emissions of VOC from building materials. Currently he is the head of the analytical laboratory and the leader of various research projects on fine particles in the atmosphere with a special focus on emission of particles from traffic. He is member of the Swiss Federal Commission on Air Hygiene advising politicians and public authorities in the field of environmental politics and measures against air pollution. In addition he represents Switzerland in the European Monitoring and Evaluation Programme within the UNECE Convention on Long Range Transport of Air Pollution and is member of various CEN working groups.
